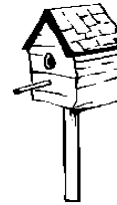
Our Requirements:

Achievement: Bear Badge

1. Sharing your world with wildlife

We will search the natural lands for wildlife and observe animals in action before going indoors to learn more about animal behavior. This program will also introduce the concept of extinction and the various reasons that it has happened.



2. Take care of your planet

This program gets the scouts on their way to completing this badge with an in depth look at recycling and how they can recycle material at home. We'll take a clean-up hike around River Bend and talk about how it is important to keep the outdoors free of garbage.

Electives

1. Space

What a great place to see the stars! River Bend has the natural advantage for stargazing. Scouts will have a chance to view stars, identify con-

stellations, and maybe see a few satellites orbiting high in the sky.

2. Nature Crafts

The outdoors provides our materials for our nature inspired art pieces. Art is a great way to also learn about colors, shapes, and concepts in nature while completing great projects!

3. Water and Soil Conservation

Dirt, mud and rocks can become part of science while we explore the different layers beneath trees, quarries, and river beds. River Bend's prairies are frequently burned, giving scouts a great opportunity to see the effects first hand.
